input from the NOP on water issues, and possibly having a speaker participate on a conference call.

The group discussed various options about how the NOSB can provide input into this issue, such as perhaps putting forth a position statement. MA and JW will check with NOP leadership about the "incidental" uses of water on organic farms, which is a grey area that is not specified in the regulations. For example, irrigation water and other water issues.
- Sustainable harvesting of marine materials (EO). The lead summarized the history of this project including some feedback from a stakeholder regarding sustainability and inputs. The stakeholder was directed to submit comments to the open docket. A member noted that wild harvest is a larger issue and the Organic Regulations don't include much guidance. The groups

- Water on an organic farm (irrigation, groundwater, well water, flood water). The CACS discussed the best way to approach the evaluation of water sources, and possible paths forward. The NOP reviewed OFPA to determine if there is any guidance or language regarding contamination or irrigation water; noting the lack of specificity on this issue. The NOP also noted that in global organic standards there is an absence of regulations regarding these issues. The CACS discussed various opportunities for input into this problem. The challenge is that it must fall within the scope of the USDA's authority. The CACS members will discuss this more with stakeholders to determine if there is a section in OFPA that could be addressed.
- Public comment. Members discussed a public comment regarding the 5-year-long waiting time
 for conversion in the discussion document on conversion of native ecosystems to organic crop
 production. The commenter noted that OFPA says 3 years, and the discussion document

- suggests a 5-year conversion. The CACS discussed whether or not they could restrict the regulations further. The NOP will review the issue, and provide feedback to the Subcommittee.

- Eliminating the Incentive to Convert Native Ecosystems/High Value Conservation Land to
 Organic Production (HB). The CACS members had a lengthy conversation about how to move
 forward with this project. Members discussed how to work within the scope of OFPA and the
 Organic regulations while preventing the conversion of native ecosystems for organic
 production. The group considered incentives, disincentives and the potential long-term
 implications under various options.

- Exempt Operations in the Supply Chain (Exempt/uncertified handlers and brokers) (SR). The
 CACS Chair noted that the topic of fraud in the supply chain (based on the recent investigation
 into grain imports from Turkey) has the organic community concerned and engaged. The lead
 noted that certified operations, and not exempt operations, have been implicated in the
 investigation. The CACS is considering a rule change that removes some of the exemptions, as
 well as guidance for organic operations regarding exemptions. SR, with assistance from TC, will
 develop a draft document for the group to discuss on the next CACS call.
- Inspector Qualifications (SR). The CACS is working on a proposal to address inspector qualifications. This project was initially part of a previous proposal on In-field, annual evaluations of inspectors (NOP 2027). To support this project work, the NOP provided the Subcommittee with a report prepared for the NOP by the International Organic Inspectors Association (IOIA) in 2011. The CACS will invite the Deputy Administrator to a future CACS call to discuss the report and provide further guidance. A member added that in addition to inspectors, reviewers are also a key component of the certification process, and should also be considered.
- Other items. Water/Fracking (TC). The NOSB Chair recently reviewed the original congressional
 conference report on OFPA and noted that a section about water was eliminated from the
 Senate version of the bill in conference committee. The members shared various ideas about
 ways in which the NOSB could address water in organic agriculture while staying within the

A member added that reviewers are also an important component in the process, and suggested that it be included in the review. The goal for this document would be a concise, succinct guidance document that could be used as part of a comprehensive training system. Currently IOIA, NOP and individual certifiers all do separate training. The NOP noted that the IOIA contains useful elements, such as the auditor qualifications and auditor-in-training documents, which also align with ISO requirements. The group discussed next steps and based on today's conversation, may address this project at the Spring 2018 meeting.

- rulemaking the justification needs to be robust and the benefits need to outweigh costs and/or address a market failure.
- **Imports.** The group discussed next steps with regard to imports, which is of great interest to the NOP and USDA.
 - Co-packer/Industry panel. The NOSB Chair noted the need for more dialogue with public, industry, and certifiers. The CACS would like to assemble a panel of industry and certifier representatives, and the NOP noted that the Spring 2018 meeting would be the best time to convene the panel. This will allow time for selection of panelists and for the Board to develop appropriate questions for the panel. Members discussed that it will likely be easier to tackle this broad topic by developing several smaller proposals to address specific problems.
 - Project topics, as presented by NOP at the NOSB meeting; Program feedback on **supply chain integrity issues (JT, BR).** The group discussed the best path forward, beginning with determining a scope for the projects. A primary issue is the complexity of the supply chains. Some specific challenges include the paper trail and documentation of organic status as product is bought and sold by multiple entities (sometimes uncertified brokers/traders) and as it passes through international borders. The NOSB is interested in finding resources about documentation required for imports, which is a complex problem in and of itself. As part of its review, the NOP is looking at document trails, including phytosanitary certificates, bills of lading, invoices, etc. Also of interest is what tools the industry is currently using. The NOP noted that part if the complexity lies in the distinction between product-level certification vs. process-based certification. The CACS would like to post questions to the open docket, and discussed how best to communicate the request for feedback on specific topics from stakeholders. The NOP will explore the options to coincide with the opening of the next meeting docket. JT will work with BR to refine the four suggested items, and possibly other ideas, and send them to the CACS. The NOSB Chair asked that the NOP provide the names of experts who can provide additional information to the CACS regarding the various potential topic areas. JT will develop a project plan and timeline for panel invitations.

- Inspector qualifications next steps (SR). The group discussed some ideas for the next iteration of the proposal on inspector qualifications. Members suggested such things as guidance and best practices for inspectors about scale of operations. A member stressed the importance of such training, which can build stronger and more confident relationships between operations and inspectors. Another member mentioned several other standards, such as Global G.A.P.,

- suggesting that it would be helpful to know how other certification schemes address inspector training and qualifications. The lead will develop an outline or draft for the next call.
- Imports. The group discussed the next steps with regard to imports. The NOP refined the four broader topics that were proposed at the Fall 2017 meeting to help focus in on areas where the CACS could develop a recommendation(s). Several questions came up during the conversation as the group tried to identify how to best address this broad topic. A member questioned how the EU verified organic certification for goods exported from countries that have been implicated in fraudulent behavior. Another member asked if there could be useful information from the recent meeting in Odessa, Ukraine, and HB agreed to reach out to participants of that meeting.

As the discussion continued, there was some uncertainty as to how the NOSB could best provide feedback given the size and complexity of the topic. A member felt that the very idea that the USDA/NOSB is attempting to close the gaps could act as a deterrent to fraud. Another member discussed the implicit level of trust that exists within the organic community and suggested that perhaps verification needs to be enhanced, which would also provide a deterrent. The NOSB Chair is reaching out to industry representatives who have experience in international trade in an effort to gather more information. The CACS would also like to invite experts to the Subcommittee calls to provide additional insight. There was a request that the program prioritize the bulleted list of possible topics, and provide additional input about other activities at the USDA regarding imports.

- Eliminating the Incentive to Convert Native Ecosystems into Organic Crop Production (HB). The lead discussed the feedback that the CACS received at the Fall 2017 NOSB meeting, and indicated she was developing ideas for the next iteration of the proposal to include some of these suggestions. The lead invited feedback about the path forward. The group discussed the inclusion of a definition of native ecosystem. The NOSB Chair suggested looking at how this issue may be affecting domestic farmers economically as compared to international farmers (given that most destruction of native ecosystems is international). A member urged the group to write the proposal they want to see go forth, with the acknowledgement that it likely won't go forward as rulemaking in the near future.
